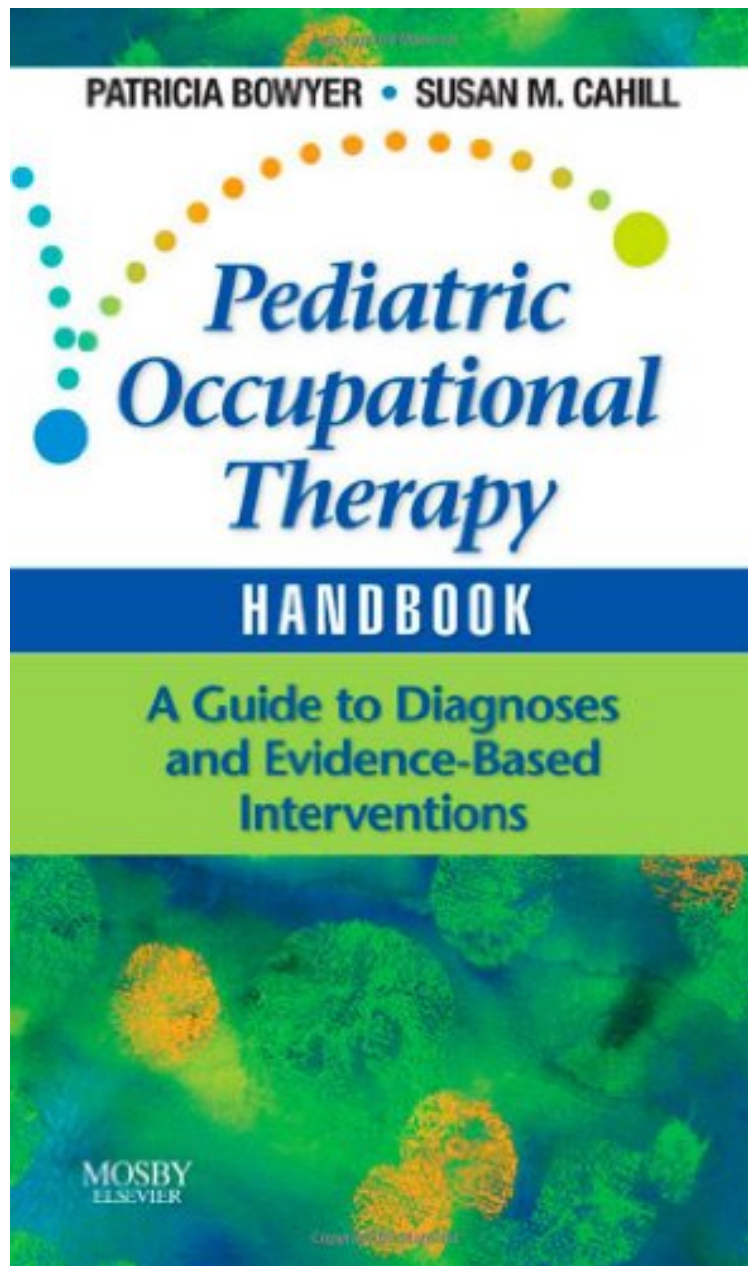

Vague and broad, not very helpful for specific intervention ideas for therapists of today's therapy world.
