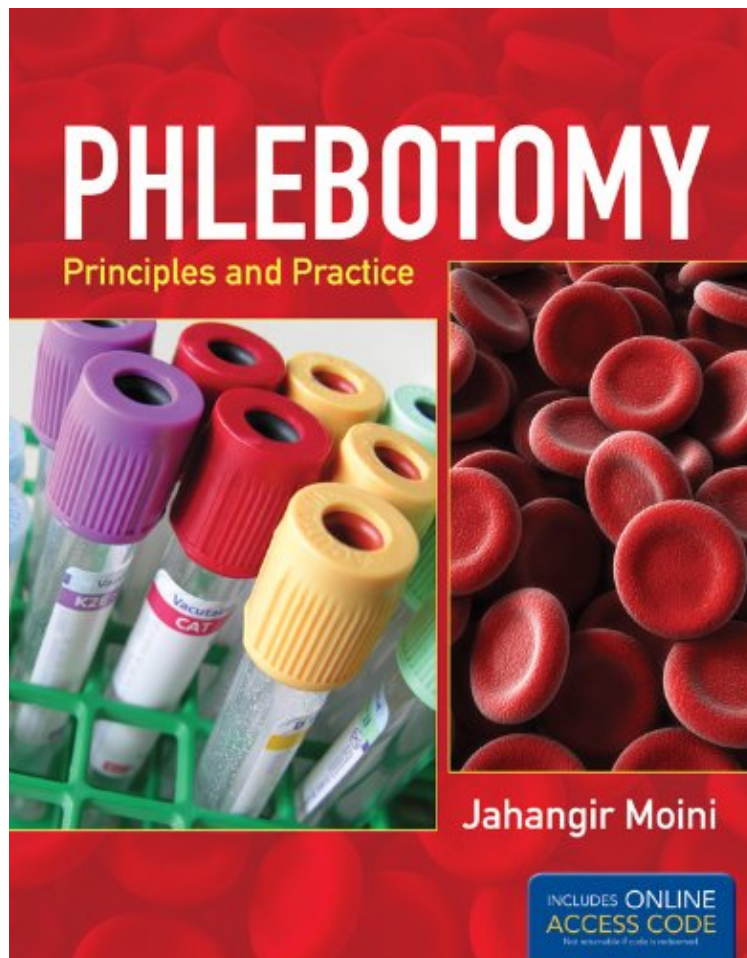


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## Phlebotomy: Principles And Practice: Includes Online Access Code for Companion Website

The objectives use terminology that is not in the text. The text does not follow a clear outline. It refers to websites that are not functional. A quote from the book: "For whole blood testing, an anticoagulant is mixed with with the whole blood for a minimum of 2 min, and testing must often occur within 1 hour of the blood's being collected. However whole blood testing is usually good for specimens up to 24 h old." So which is it? Is it 1 hour or is it up to 24 hours. And if it is up to 24 hours then why even say, "within 1 hour". If there are specific tests that need to be performed

within that first hour and others that can wait up to 24 hours, then say so!
