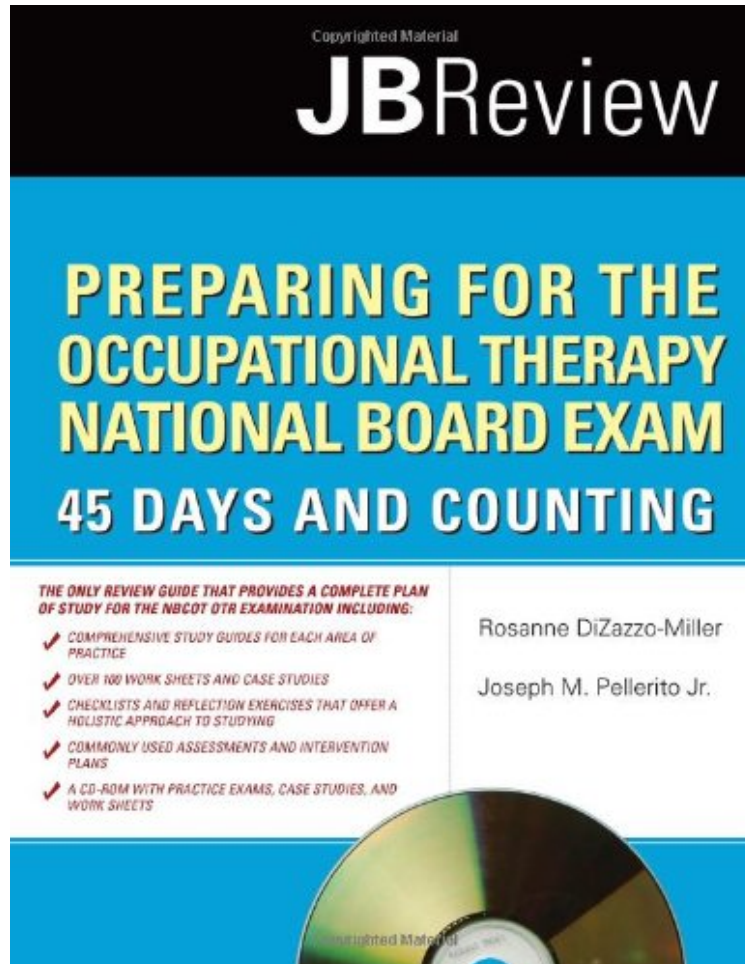

While reading it I was not retaining much of the information. Using 45 Days and Counting while filling out and completing the worksheets really helped me retain the information. Before getting it, I felt like there was this huge, ominous amount of material to cover with no idea where to begin. It is also nice that it helps to keep you organized by letting you know how many days you should spend on each chapter, though I generally use this as a loose guide and sometime spend more or less time on it depending on my comfort level with the material. There are some negatives to the book though: I saw mentioned in other reviews that at many points it is just a very basic outline- this is true. Sometimes the bullet points will have one or two words with no description, which gets a little frustrating. They do provide references for each outline section to let you know where the material is from, and this is helpful if you have the book they are referring to, but if you don't then you are kind of out of luck unless you look the info up somewhere else. Also, since the book is a little bit older, it refers to the older edition of some books (Pedretti and OT for children, to be specific) so the page numbers given to refer to don't match up with the current editions. Overall though, I have found it helpful. I am also using another study set and the material seems to match up closely.9 of 10 people found the following review helpful. CD-ROM infoBy ZachThis CD gives you both customized quizzes and performance results that tell you what you want to know. Mac users beware; the software will give you test questions by chapter in an Html format but will not provide you with the tweaked out bells and whistles provided for the PC version that I enjoyed. I tried both- the Mac version doesn't provide you with the domain specific or customized test result features like the PC version does. The read me files or instructions do not explicitly tell you about the absence of these features either. Only after borrowing a friends PC did I see the obvious advantages of using the PC for this CD. Another plus about this CD-ROM is that it the content is not so hard as to discourage you like other learning aides (ie. TherapyEd review tests). Although I did find the TherapyEd book helpful to build my knowledge base for taking the NBCOT (I did not pass the first time), I learned that many details the T-ed book provided were too specific. The NBCOT makes you wait 45 days to take it again. If you're in that position, I'd recommend this book due to the 45 day structure, the specialized feedback, and the encouraging content.
