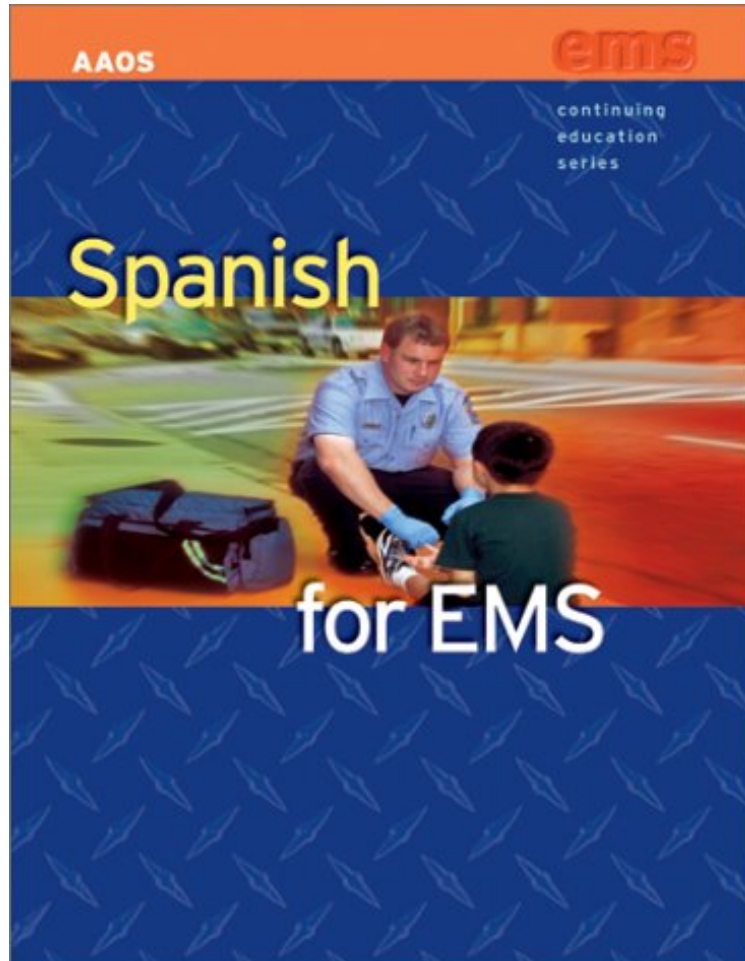

From what I can tell so far is that this book is laid out to give you the basic fundamentals of medical Spanish.However, it cannot prepare you for everything. What I mean by that is when a patient explains to you why they are not feeling well or how they were injured, this book cannot help you decode each individual story. In order to do that, advanced study in Spanish is needed. That's NOT TO SAY THOUGH that this book is worthless! In fact, it is still extremely helpful!As far as the lady speaking on the CD goes, that accent is a common one you will hear. Yes it is thick, but once you understand it

you can have a better understanding for those who speak Spanish with thick accents. I encourage those who wish to learn medical Spanish to use out in the field to consider purchasing this book. This can give you a beginning foundation in communicating in Spanish. My high school Spanish instructor once told me "speaking broken Spanish is better than not speaking Spanish at all". In order to speak Spanish well, you will need to get additional study aids or take a class that help you learn the language itself and not how to just speak medical Spanish. Hope this gives you a better idea on how to learn to speak medical Spanish!

Our volunteer ambulance service used this as the textbook for a "Spanish for EMS" course that was taught by a bilingual paramedic. In that context, it worked very, very well. I should say, I do speak rudimentary Spanish. That helped a lot. However, there were other people in the class who had no Spanish language at all. They said that the course and workbook in combination left them much better able to communicate with Spanish speaking patients.

The Spanish phrases have no phonetic pronunciations to guide you and on the CD the examples are all recited very quickly by a woman with a very thick accent. I recommend "Workplace Spanish for Fire and EMS Personnel." The phonetic pronunciations are given in the book and, on the CD, the phrases are recited slowly by a female with an accent, then by a caucasian without an accent.

This self-teaching Spanish course, composed of a text and audio CD-ROM, supplies EMS providers with quick and easy phrases and questions in Spanish for those situations in which English will not suffice.
